Spacing pregnancies is healthier for you and your baby.

Family planning helps you and your partner decide if and when to have another baby.





- Yearly women's GYN exams
- Pap tests
- Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) testing
- Lab services for family planning and STI testing
- Prescription birth control
- Over-the-counter birth control\*
- Sterilization procedures
- Education and counseling
- Transportation to covered family planning services

\* With a prescription

Women and men may be eligible if they:

- Live in Virginia
- Meet the monthly income limits\*
- Are US citizens or qualified legal immigrants

\*If you were on Medicaid or FAMIS MOMS while pregnant, you may qualify for Plan First.



# How Do I Apply?

- 1) Apply online at www.commonhelp.virginia.gov or
- 2) Call Cover Virginia at 1-855-242-8282 to apply on the phone or
- 3) Print out and complete a paper application and mail it to your local Department of Social Services or
- 4) Visit your local Department of Social Services in the town or county in which vou live.
